that went to Caleb Hislop.

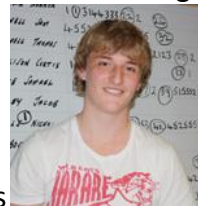

Third place went to Samael Rice on 62 and to makeup the top five Dylan Smith had 56 votes followed by Broke Emmerton with 52. An indication on how intense the voting was is indicated by several players polling well, others were Jake Brakey 51, Zac Wish-Wilson 50, Robbie Fox 49, Tyler Keene 46, David McCrae 41, and Thomas Mitchell 31.

The senior count got under way later than expected and after 6 rounds the top five were Darren Banham 43, Brentyn Milverton, Kade Munday and Mathew Stephenson all on 33 followed by Luke Shackelton on 29.

After 12 rounds Brentyn Milverton on 44 had not progressed as well as Darren Banham on 88, Luke Shackelton 84, Kade Munday 78 followed by Mathew Stephenson with 68.

After 15 rounds there were four players who could win Kade Munday on 107 closely followed by Luke Shackelton 105 and two players Darren Banham and Mathew Stephenson with 98.

Kade Munday eventually took the win on 138 votes from Mathew Stephenson with 124 votes. Third place was shared by Darren Banham and Luke Shackelton on 107 votes. Nick Walters polled well to come in with 53 just ahead of Zachery Mihocek on 49 and Rudy Barrett did some late season polling to end with 48 votes.
